

We are delighted to present the Grand Prix collection of the Province of Canada formed by the late Ron Brigham, who passed away on August 4, 2022 at the age of 78. The collection garnered many gold-medals on the international stage in the late 1990s, culminating in Grand Prix awards at AUSTRALIA 99 and at BELGICA 2001. He is the only Canadian to achieve the highest award in competitive philately. We hope the perusal and the study of the collection will inspire others to follow a path of their own.

Ron was a Fellow of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada and a member of several other philatelic organizations such as the Collectors Club of New York and the Club de Monte-Carlo de l'Élite de la Philatélie. His passion and tenacity in acquiring the greatest items were not only limited to the Pence & Cents issues of Canada, but also in post-Confederation issues from



Large Queens to modern era. At the height of his collecting and exhibiting, his holdings filled more than 150 volumes! In a series of auction sales between 2014 and 2016, his collections were dispersed to the delight of collectors. However, his beloved and cherished Pence & Cents were kept out of the limelight.

We are now presenting the second portion of the collection (to be offered in four parts), offering the possibility of bidding on a wider assortment of lots. In addition to the great rarities, many of which are of unique status, collectors will find beautiful proofs often showing well-documented plate varieties, single stamps and multiples in the highest quality attainable, noteworthy postal history with rare frankings, beautiful advertising covers, and much more.

The presentation and organization of the lots follows the life span of each stamp design as opposed to simple catalogue numbers. For example, the three pence Beaver of 1851 to 1858 precedes the Five cent of 1859 to 1868; then the six pence Consort 1851-1858 is followed by the Ten cent of 1859 and 1868, and so on. This association shows the evolution of each classic design.

Like all of the greatest collectors, Brigham began early in acquiring important pieces, laying the foundation of what was to become one of the very best Canadian collections ever assembled. His rapid progress in acquiring rarities has become legendary. While researching and lotting the collection, we recognized many key items that originated from three of the most prominent collections of their generation – the Sam Nickle Pence & Cents issue collections sold in 1988 & 1993 respectively, the Weill Brothers' Stock dispersed in 1989 and the famous, extensive "Lindemann" collections of Ian Bett, sold by private treaty in 1997 through John Jamieson of Saskatoon Stamp Centre. With these three instrumental turns of events, Brigham seized the opportunity to acquire many rarities needed for a great collection. Anywhere from a generation to several decades have now passed since any of these items have surfaced at auction.

We invite you to participate in Part II, where we present some of the greatest rarities of the Six pence & ten cents Prince Albert – Consort stamps.

The 6p and 10c Prince Albert

Prince Albert was born in one of the Saxon Duchies of the German Confederation, in a family connected to many of Europe's ruling monarchs. On February 10, 1840, he married Queen Victoria and received the formal title HRH Prince Albert. British peerage was later granted to him in June of 1857 as Prince Consort. From the outset of the marriage, his popularity with the British public was unenthusiastic, partly because of anti-German sentiment. However, Prince Albert supported and was involved in many public causes, such as campaigning for the abolition of slavery worldwide and organizing the Great Exhibition of 1851.

Alfred Jones, engraver at Rawdon, Wright, Hatch and Edson, New York, took a portrait of HRH Prince Albert in military uniform as the model for Canada's First Issue six pence stamp. The portrait (illustrated here) is based on a drawing by W. Drummond and was engraved during the 1840s by British printmaker,



William Henry Egleton. The first shipment of 6 pence stamps (1,004 sheets of 100) was delivered to the Canadian Government on May 4, 1851 and the stamps were available to the public as early as mid-May.

As a result of the popularity of the 3 penny Beaver and 12 penny Black, the Prince Consort stamps have been somewhat neglected by philatelists. Spanning a period of about 17 years, two currencies and six major catalogue numbers, the 6 pence & 10 cent stamps offer myriad shades, printings and varieties. It is interesting to note that several distinctive shades on both Pence & Cents issues are still unlisted by major catalogues.

Over 118,000 sheets were printed during the Pence and Decimal era. The most common usage for a 6 pence or a 10 cent stamp was for mail addressed to the United States. It was also required for double weight letters on mail to Canada and to the Colonies of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. An advanced, award-winning collection could be achieved focusing on the evolution of the stamp from 1851 to 1867, with proofs, stamps and postal history. Surprisingly enough, we do not recall seeing such a collection in recent years at stamp exhibitions.

Part Two of the Brigham Estate showcases some of the very best and greatest rarities of the Six pence & Ten cent stamps, some personal favourites of the entire collection. Among them are mint pairs of 6 pence on laid and on wove paper, and also what is considered by many to be "the most outstanding piece in Canadian philately" – namely the block of twelve and single on cover. Among the rarities in later printings are the 6 pence on thick soft fibrous paper in an horizontal mint OG strip of three, as well as a superb mint perforated 6 pence grey violet shade. Many of these key items were acquired by Brigham more than three decades ago! The challenging 10 cent stamp is also well represented with the finest extant mint 10c black brown, last sold in 1983 for more than double its then catalogue value, a later printing mint OG plate imprint block of eight that is believed to be the largest surviving multiple (of all printings 1859 to 1867), the only known Decimal cover to New South Wales, and the unique 10 cent registered Military Concessionary letter rate cover.

Despite two pressed vertical creases (one between stamps), small flaws and aesthetic repairs at lower corners, this block is in much better condition than the other known block (its current whereabouts or if still intact, are unknown to us); possessing very prominent laid lines, mostly clear to ample margins and retaining unusually large part characteristic dull, ORIGINAL GUM with lower pair very lightly hinged. The ultimate mint block of Canada and the LARGEST KNOWN MULTIPLE of Canada's First Stamp - a world-class rarity of the highest order that will appeal to serious collectors of Canada as well as connoisseurs of First Issues of the World, Fine to Very Fine OG

Around 1879, Arthur Goodall, then president of the American Bank Note Company, gave instructions to employ the original dies from their archives to produce special die proofs; these were to be distributed to business friends and allies. From each original die, in this case the 5 cent Beaver, 3 to 5 examples were produced in five distinctive colours, with slight shades known amongst some dies. The colours printed were black, brownish red, brown, greenish blue and bluish green, on a distinctively small piece of india paper, die sunk on slightly larger cards. Over the last 140+ years, some have been separated from their archival card (as the one offered here).

A very interesting observation surfaced when studying the Harmers of London 1938 sale, likely the very first time the cover made an appearance at auction. Although the collecting of postal history was only in its infancy in the 1930s, the cover sold for £600 hammer, an enormous sum at the time. None of the almost 400 other lots surpassed the £85 mark, except for one. This was Lot 350, an unused example of the world-famous Mauritius 1847 2p deep blue "POST OFFICE", which brought £1,350 (image below). In today's marketplace, this stamp would easily fetch a sum well into seven figures!
