



THE FINER OF TWO KNOWN MISSING COLOUR ERRORS

1970 Five cent Christmas, a phenomenal se-tenant upper left block of fifteen, the first vertical strip of five is properly printed, the second shows only a trace of printing on the top three stamps, the lower two plus the third vertical strip are completely devoid of printing; there is a surface thin on the lower centre blank. This was caused by a second sheet slightly adhering prior to the printing process, which required three passes through the press, plus the perforator and the guillotine. This second sheet was the cause of the printing error, which is unlike any other we have seen in Canadian Philately.

Background documentation from Kasimir Bileski (dated March 9, 1971) accompanies this item as does the block from the upper sheet. In discussing its history, he states that there was a lower block from the same sheet. It was salvaged, albeit in a damaged state. Its gum had to be removed as it was completely stuck to the upper sheet when originally discovered by a non-collector. The upper block offered here however, retains its original gum, showing only a couple of light fingerprints, but is essentially NH and by far the finer of the two known.

We could not agree more with K. Bileski who stated "It certainly is an interesting category as far as any listing is concerned: stamp + 2 blanks? Such an error is a first for Canada." (Unitrade 519-523 error; original retail price in March of 1971 was \$7,500)
