Such stamps are not easy to come by and we are always pleased when our item count for these Selected Rarities catalogues reaches one hundred and we can go ahead and

start production on a new edition. You will find a nice mix of both specialized as well as high quality material in Selected Rarities XIII. Provinces kick things off with seven items including a mint block of the Nova Scotia three pence. Newfoundland remains extremely popular; look for choice pence issues as well as complete booklets, airmails and an officially sealed die proof.

No less than ten selected Pence Issues start the Canadian section, followed by a showpiece block of six of the 1c Queen Victoria (Item 1333). Large Queens with a mint 2c block and imperforate pairs of the Small Queens are present, followed by used blocks of the \$4.00 and \$5.00 Jubilee. Later mint singles in choice quality abound, with Leafs, Numerals, Québecs and Admirals. In the modern era don't miss the misperforated block of "A" stamp and the missing Satellite corner block (Items 1390-1391). Back of the book closes things as usual. Items 1397-1399 feature five-hole perforated O.H.M.S.

Thanks to all of you who ordered from our last catalogue. I hope you will find something of interest in this current edition. We are continually buying collections, not only Canadian but Commonwealth and Foreign as well. Please contact us if you have something available for sale.
