

Our Selected Rarities catalogue XXIX is a humdinger to say the least. An offering of just one hundred items comprise over a million dollars worth of retail value. Rarities abound, especially in the classic period. Among other things you will note mint examples of the New Brunswick one shilling and Nova Scotia six pence yellow green, as well as a rare unused Newfoundland one shilling scarlet vermilion. Only four values of the 1857 first issue of Newfoundland are possible in blocks of four and you will find all of them here.

Canada begins with the earliest known cover from the country bearing a postage stamp, an item that will appeal to collectors of Canada and of Great Britain alike. Then things really get rolling with an unused



example of the six pence laid paper, a mint OG twelve penny, mint examples of the six pence on both wove and hard papers, mint singles of both papers of the ten penny blue, a fabulous mint pair of the seven and one half pence green plus a mint single in the deeper shade and finally a mint perforated six pence. I think you will agree that this is the most spectacular offering of mint Canadian pence issues in many years.

The Large and Small Queen Issues are represented by some desirable covers. There is a good showing of King Edward VII including a rare 2¢ tête-bêche block of twelve. Also well covered is the popular 1928 Scroll Issue, featuring complete sets of the stamps, proofs, imperforates and part-perforates.

Of special note is a set of imperforate plate blocks of Canada's War. It is thought that only two complete sets currently exist.

Worthy of mention are several rarely seen printed on gum side errors in the QEII era. There are eleven in all with everything from the 1¢ Centennial to the elusive 4¢ Postage Due. These are some of the most desirable modern errors that Canada has to offer.

We will be attending the Calgary BNAPEX show in September as well as the Club Monaco event in Monte Carlo in December.



THE FIRST LETTER ORIGINATING FROM CANADA BEARING A POSTAGE STAMP

1840 (December 7) Folded lettersheet with handwritten "Fort Malden, Amherstburg Upper Canada December 8, 1840" addressed to Dover, England, showing a very clear Amherstburg double arc dispatch at top left along with PAID handstamp and manuscript "Sterling ½" and "Currency 1/4" dual rates (1), carried by Cunard Line Steamer (2), arrival in London with PAID JA 18 1841 datestamp in red and arrived same-day at Dover with JA 18 backstamp; redirected to Sandwich JA 19, due a penny "1d" manuscript and then forwarded again, now with postage paid to "Poets Corner, Westminster". Mail forwarded to a new address after acceptance, became liable to one penny British inland postage, in this case a clear margined example of the 1840 One penny black, Plate 8 [OF] was placed and cancelled by Maltese Cross.

Canadian postage stamps were not issued until 1851. This letter bearing the world's first postage stamp issued in May of 1840 is the earliest known letter from Canada bearing a postage stamp.
